A Brief History

1974: City of San Antonio begins providing magistration services for all arrests in Bexar County at the Bexar County jail. Nov. 2007: State District Court Magistrates created – magistration of Class A and B misdemeanors and felonies transferred to Bexar County. ILA establishes County contribution to ¹/₂ of detention costs.

1989: City transfers magistration and detention services to 401 S. Frio facility. 1989 – 2007: City provides magistration and detention services for all arrests in Bexar County with no cost contribution from the County.




PRESENT DAY

April 30, 2019: Bexar County Commissioners vote to contract with City to provide 24/7 magistration services on new on-site arrests for all agencies within Bexar County.

May 1, 2019: 24/7 magistration at both the JIAA and AAPC by City Magistrates commences. May 2, 2019: Council approves Agenda item #19-3822 Misc. Interlocal Agreement – Ordinance amending the Interlocal Agreement with Bexar County relating to the provision of government services.
