



 Matched by University Health System (UHS) to create The Institute for Trauma Informed Care



#### **Next Steps**

- Currently vetting draft plan with stakeholder groups
- By Oct. 15 DV Commission Committees will select priorities for FY 2020
- Final DV Comprehensive Plan and RFP funding priority recommendations presented at B Session on Oct. 30
- On Dec. 1 RFP process will begin for the remaining \$500k

*New funding to Delegate Agencies = \$500,000* 

New funding to Metro Health DV Programs and Services = \$500,000

  - Access to Treatment
  - > System/Structure Integration





### Mental Health System Gap Analysis



#### **Recommendations:**

- Focus on Prevention
- Expand STCC to Coordinate Pre and Post Hospitalization

#### **Actions:**

- Pre-Crisis Urgent Care Facility
  - ➤ Walk-in Medical Clinics
  - Focus on Families
- Convene Stakeholders
  - ➤ Improve Current State
  - ► Vision Future State



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
