

ORDINANCE

AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION IN THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER REIMBURSABLE AGREEMENT PROGRAM WITH THE TRANSPORTATION SECURITY ADMINISTRATION FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT SUPPORT AT EACH PASSENGER SECURITY SCREENING CHECKPOINT AT THE SAN ANTONIO INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT, WITH TSA REIMBURSING THE CITY UP TO \$513,038.00 ANNUALLY FOR THREE YEARS.

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WHEREAS, the City has participated in the Law Enforcement Officer Reimbursable Agreement Program with the Transportation Security Administration for law enforcement support at two passenger security screening checkpoints at the San Antonio International Airport for three years; and

WHEREAS, the City and TSA would like to continue participating in this program through the authorization of a new agreement; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City to enter into a new three year cooperative agreement with TSA which was accepted by TSA through a grant application and award process;
NOW THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City Manager or the Aviation Director is authorized to submit to the TSA a three-year federal cooperative agreement (federal reimbursement grant) in an annual amount of up to \$513,038.00 for posting of law enforcement officers at each San Antonio International Airport Terminal Checkpoint.

SECTION 2. The City Manager or the Aviation Director is further authorized to execute any and all necessary documents to effectuate the agreement and acceptance of funds. All steps previously taken by City staff to ensure timely submission of required documents to TSA are ratified.

SECTION 3. The City Manager or the Aviation Director is authorized to accept up to \$513,038.00 annually from the Transportation Security Administration to provide funding for posting a Law Enforcement Officer at each San Antonio International Airport terminal checkpoint.

SECTION 4. *Fiscal details will be added upon receipt*

SECTION 5. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Deputy Chief Financial Officer, City of San Antonio. The Deputy Chief Financial Officer, may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific SAP Fund Numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP Internal

Orders, SAP Fund Centers, SAP Cost Centers, SAP Functional Areas, SAP Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and SAP GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance is effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective ten days after passage.
