

ORDINANCE 2020-04-16-0267

AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF A GRANT APPLICATION IN AN AMOUNT UP TO \$11,800.00 FROM OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR, CRIMINAL JUSTICE DIVISION, FOR THE TRANSITION TO THE FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION'S NATIONAL INCIDENT-BASED REPORTING SYSTEM; AND AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF FUNDS UPON AWARD.

WHEREAS, the San Antonio Police Department (SAPD) is currently upgrading its record management system and mobile field reporting software to comply with converting from the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program to the mandated Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI's) National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS); and

WHEREAS, the Office of the Governor (OOG), Criminal Justice Division (CJD), has grant funds in an amount up to \$11,800.00 available to assist the SAPD to transition to the FBI's NIBRS; and

WHEREAS, this grant will assist with funding the appropriate software needed for the required updates; and

WHEREAS, this grant does not require an in-kind or cash match; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The Chief of the San Antonio Police Department is the City's authorized official, and he is hereby authorized to apply for, accept, reject, alter, or terminate an application for grant funds in an amount up to \$11,800.00 from the OOG, CJD for the transition to the FBI's NIBRS as the standard reporting method of the UCR program, for the grant period October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2021.

SECTION 2. In the event of loss or misuse of CJD grant funds, the City Council will return all funds to the OOG, CJD.


SECTION 3. Should funding be awarded, upon acceptance of this award, new funds and internal order numbers will be created, upon which the award amount will be appropriated from the OOG. A final budget, which will include SAP Internal Orders and SAP GL Accounts, will be submitted by the SAPD upon award.

SECTION 4. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Deputy Chief Financial Officer, City of San Antonio. The Deputy Chief Financial Officer may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific SAP Fund Numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP Internal

Orders, SAP Fund Centers, SAP Cost Centers, SAP Functional Areas, SAP Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and SAP GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.


SECTION 5. This Ordinance is effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective ten days after passage.
