





#### Contact Tracing Capacity (P3)







### **ASSESS THE COMMUNITY**

- Covid-19 Self-Screening
   Website
  - Metro Health will promote the COVID-19 Self-Screening Website twice a week, through social media and robo-calls until March 2021





#### **ASSESS THE COMMUNITY**

- Community Survey
  - Metro Health will administer a community survey, every two-weeks, for a total of three months and analyze findings by August 2020.

#### **TESTING**

- Conduct a Study to Determine the Prevalence of Asymptomatic Infections
  - Metro Health will conduct an innovative public health/academic study to assess the rates of asymptomatic infections, describe the demographic characteristics of asymptomatic infections, and the risk of transmission by this segment of positive cases by July 2020



# RESPONSE MAINTAIN PPE CACHE FOR COSA

#### Warehouse Space

• The goal would be to co-locate resources associated with the response to COVID-19 in a centralized location for the management of Resources.

#### Establish a Distribution Network

 Equipment and vehicles needed for the distribution of PPE to Departments throughout the City.

#### Fit Testing Facility

 Respirators, need fit testing to comply with CDC and OSHA requirements.

#### Decontamination Equipment

 Special equipment to ensure the sanitation of vehicles and work locations.





# ENHANCING THE RESPONSE CAPACITY AND CAPABILITY

- Increase Medical Resources for Metro Health and SAFD
  - Assistant Medical Director and Infection Control Nurse for SAFD
  - Enhance the ability of Telemedicine
  - Contractual Medical Resources for Metro Health
- Creating a Triage and Minor Emergency Line For Citizens
  - Pre-arrival triage and informational needs of citizens
- EMS Equipment
  - Specialized Equipment for both Fire, EMS, and MIH units
- Technology Equipment
  - Telemedicine
  - **Training Capacity**

    - Large Scale Mobile Testing at Congregate Sites
    - Deployments for Large Scale Testing

#### **EXPANSION OF MIH**

- Testing Teams
  - Training of 100 Department Personnel For This Function
  - Adding Positions to MIH for Contact Teams
- Extended Care Teams
  - Expanding the Role of MIH to Provide Inhome Care to Prevent the Need of Hospital Admission for COVID-19 Patients








#### **CONTACT TRACING**

- Recruit & Train
  - Metro Health will utilize a 70-15-90 rule to recruit, train and deploy 175 case tracers as new positive cases increase over a period of time beginning on June 1, 2020.





#### **CONTACT TRACING**

#### Innovate

 Metro Health and ITSD will complete a 30-day pilot with emocha mobile health technology to monitor positive patients and contact daily for signs and symptoms by June 30, 2020





# **ASSURE**

#### **ENFORCEMENT**

• The City's Development Services Department, with the inclusion and cooperation of team members including Metro Health, Center City Development, and SAPD will inspect 10 business a week and educate and or administer warnings and citations for violations of the local public health declaration orders beginning on June 1, 2020,







# **ASSURE**

#### **EDUCATION AND OUTREACH**

## Community Health & Prevention Team

• The multi-agency, Community Health & Prevention Team will canvas neighborhoods, twice a week, to educate and promote testing locations, starting with census tracts with the highest number of residents of color and low income until March 2021.



• Metro Health's COVID-19 Community Hotline will answer and provide critical information to over 45,000 residents by December 31, 2020

#### Provider Education

 Metro Health's Health Authority will provide 20 TeleTown Hall education sessions by December 31, 2020













# Timeline: May 2020 - March 2021
