

CURRENT REQUIREMENTS



OR

Headquartered in San Antonio Metropolitan Statistical Area (SAMSA, including Bexar and seven surrounding counties) Maintain branch location in SAMSA for at least one year; AND

20% of employees based in SAMSA branch (including full-time, part-time, or contract employees)

ORIGINAL GOAL OF SIGNIFICANT BUSINESS PRESENCE ELIGIBILITY

- Modified from 2007 SBEDA Ordinance
 - Local office for 1 year and 10 local employees

 To attract local investment by SMWBEs headquartered outside of SAMSA

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

Remove Significant Business Presence as eligibility option

- If recommended:
 - Immediate policy change (October 2020)
 OR
 - Consider with the next SBEDA Ordinance
 Amendment process in March 2022

Registered Vendors	7,579	1,368	64
Payments	\$444 million	\$248.9 million	\$4.1 million

17 SBEDA eligible firms with HQ outside of SAMSA received \$4.1 million in payments (FY 2019)
