

Culinary Health Education for Families (CHEF) GRANT PROPOSAL

Background

In 2018, Pre-K 4 SA and CHEF entered into a partnership for the purpose of expanding the CHEF curriculum to prekindergarten programs throughout San Antonio. In the initial phase of the program, CHEF provided Pre-K 4 SA with a grant (\$103,000) to hire a Pre-K 4 SA Professional Learning Specialist dedicated to the CHEF expansion. In exchange for this funding, Pre-K 4 SA agreed to:

- Align the CHEF Program to high-quality early learning standards;
- Develop a professional learning plan to support implementation of CHEF Program in Pre-K 4 SA classrooms;
- Pilot the CHEF prekindergarten curriculum in 25 Pre-K 4 SA classrooms and revise and finalize the CHEF prekindergarten curriculum based on the pilot experience;
- Implement the finalized CHEF prekindergarten curriculum in all 100 Pre-K 4 SA classrooms;
- Develop professional learning modules to train teachers in the use of the CHEF prekindergarten curriculum
- Develop an evaluation plan for measuring the efficacy of the CHEF prekindergarten curriculum;
- Present CHEF Program initiative with key stakeholders in partner school districts and child develop centers; and
- Identify, in collaboration with CHEF, 1-2 partner districts and a small number of child development centers to implement CHEF Program in Pre-K classrooms.

All of these goals were accomplished. However, although a formal evaluation of the program has been developed, it was not completed due to the closure of schools in response to COVID-19. The formal evaluation is scheduled for fall 2020 when schools reopen.

Within Pre-K 4 SA, the CHEF curriculum has become an integral part of the program. It is one of four curricular innovations that Pre-K 4 SA includes as a critical tenet of its high-quality early learning model. As a signature innovation, CHEF is highlighted when other programs request information about Pre-K 4 SA's approach. CHEF is also promoted to other San Antonio early learning programs as an aspect of improving program quality.

Chef Expansion 2020-21

Building on the success of CHEF in Pre-K 4 SA classrooms, Pre-K 4 SA offered other early learning programs the opportunity to adopt the CHEF prekindergarten curriculum by making the CHEF prekindergarten curriculum an option in the Pre-K 4 SA Competitive Grants program. Twenty-three schools in six districts chose to include CHEF in their grant proposals. This represents 121 early learning classrooms across San Antonio (Table 1).

The number of schools requesting support to implement the CHEF prekindergarten curriculum was greater than anticipated. Although Pre-K 4 SA has dedicated resources to this project (Table 2), the Pre-K 4 SA allocation is insufficient to support the expansion of the CHEF prekindergarten curriculum into all grant-funded schools.
