**AUTHORIZING THE EXTENSION OF LINE-OF-DUTY
INJURY LEAVE FOR SAN ANTONIO FIRE DEPARTMENT
FIRE ENGINEER.**

WHEREAS, section 143.073 of the Texas Local Government Code provides that a firefighter injured in the line of duty is entitled to line-of-duty injury leave with full pay for a period commensurate with the injury and not to exceed one year; and

WHEREAS, section 143.073 also provides that a municipality's governing body may extend the line-of-duty injury leave beyond one year; and

WHEREAS, San Antonio Fire Department Fire Engineer Ronald Carrillo was injured in the line of duty on October 8, 2018, and, as a result, required leave in excess of one year to address said injury; and

WHEREAS, Fire Engineer Carrillo is requesting an extension of line-of-duty injury leave beyond one year for the period December 14, 2019, to February 19, 2020; and


WHEREAS, approving the requested extension will restore 408 hours of accrued leave to Fire Engineer Carrillo; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:


SECTION 1. An extension beyond one year of San Antonio Fire Department Fire Engineer Carrillo's line-of-duty injury leave for the period December 14, 2019 to February 19, 2020, is hereby approved.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance is effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective ten days after passage.
