





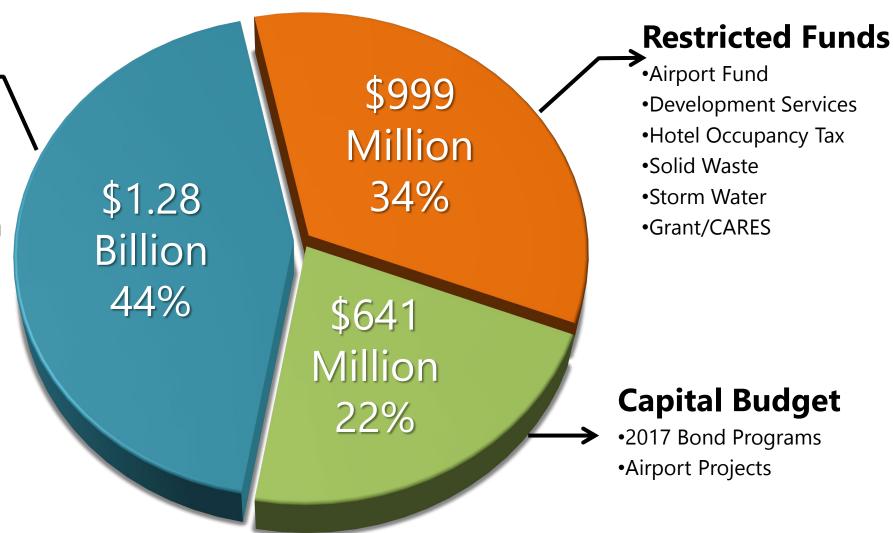

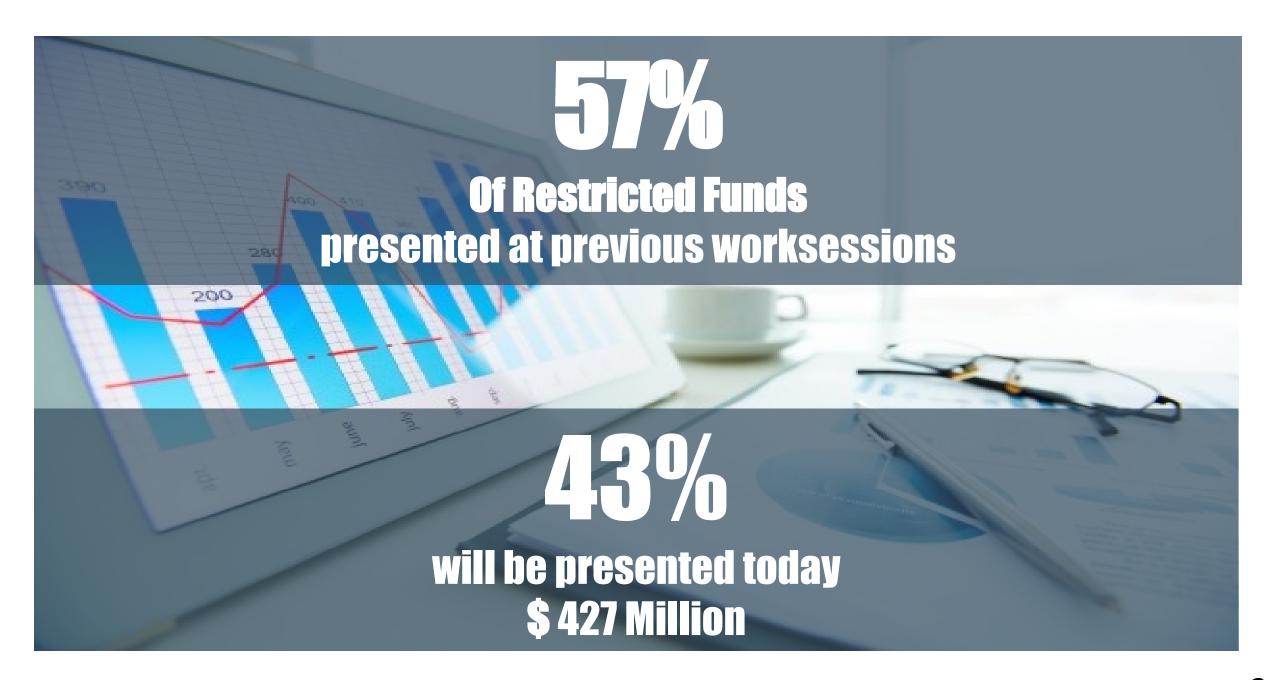

Supports most basic City services: Police, Fire, Streets, Metro Health, Parks, Human Services



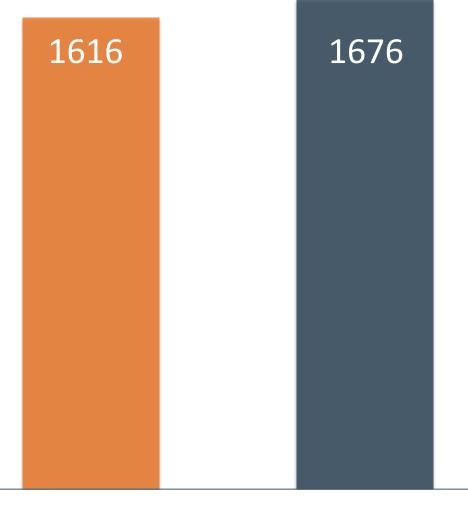

Storm Water Fee

- Critical role in protecting public health and safety
 - Reduces flood risk and maintains water quality
- Utility created in 1993 reduces pollutants that enter waterways
- Utility oversight through Municipal Separate Storm
 Sewer System (MS4) permit
- Work supported by the fee is federally mandated under the Clean Water Act
- · Fee is collected on monthly SAWS bill

- Impervious cover methodology
- Percent rate increases
