ORDINANCE

AUTHORIZING CONTINUATION OF AN INTERAGENCY COOPERATION AGREEMENT WITH DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY, TO PROVIDE THE SAN ANTONIO POLICE DEPARTMENT BLOOD ALCOHOL AND DRUG TOXICOLOGY ANALYSIS IN INTOXICATION ASSAULT AND INTOXICATION MANSLAUGHTER CASES FOR A FIVE-YEAR TERM BEGINNING SEPTEMBER 1, 2020 AND ENDING AUGUST 31, 2025.

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WHEREAS, the City entered into an Interagency Cooperative Agreement with the Department of Public Safety on August 20, 2015 to provide the San Antonio Police Department with blood alcohol and drug toxicology analysis in intoxication assault and intoxication manslaughter cases; and

WHEREAS, City Council approved the initial Interagency Cooperative Agreement; and

WHEREAS, City staff now recommends continuation of the Interagency Cooperative Agreement with the Department of Public Safety to provide needed public safety services; and

WHEREAS, said agreement provides for a five-year term, beginning September 3, 2020 through September 2, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the estimated annual first year cost of this agreement is \$174,457.00; NOW THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City Manager or designee is hereby authorized to execute continuation of an Interagency Cooperative Agreement with DPS for a period beginning September 3, 2020 to September 2, 2025. A copy of the Interagency Cooperative Agreement in final form is attached as **Exhibit 1.**

SECTION 2. RESERVED FOR FISCAL LANGUAGE.

SECTION 3. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Director of Finance, City of San Antonio. The Director of Finance, may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific SAP Fund Numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP Internal Orders, SAP Fund Centers, SAP

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Cost Centers, SAP Functional Areas, SAP Funds Reservation Document Numbers and SAP GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.
SECTION 4. This Ordinance becomes effective immediately if passed and approved by eight (8) affirmative votes; otherwise this Ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days from the date of passage.
