



COMPILE AND EVALUATE EVIDENCE



- M/WBE contracting programs must meet "strict constitutional scrutiny" (*Richmond v Croson*, Supreme Court 1989)
 - > Statistical evidence of disparities in the market area
 - Anecdotal evidence of barriers to full and fair inclusion
 - Remedies must be "narrowly tailored" to that evidence
- Industry standard is to conduct a disparity study every five to seven years to reevaluate the factors listed above





	2010 Disparity Study	2015 Disparity Study
Percent Paid to M/WBEs	16%	23%
Dollars Paid to M/WBEs	\$156 Million	\$343 Million

- Minority and women-owned businesses make up nearly 43% of all available firms
- Disparities continue in the broader San Antonio marketplace
- Anecdotal evidence supports quantitative contracting disparity findings
- > Recommended program continuation, with potential amendments





- > Evaluate City of San Antonio contracting data from years 2014 to 2020
- > Evaluate other various public and private sector data
- > Research if disparities exist in the following business ownership ethnic and gender categories:

All Minority and Women Categories Combined	African American	Asian American
Hispanic American	Native American	Women

> Research will be broken down in the following business industry categories:

All Industries Categories Combined	Construction	Architecture & Engineering

- 1) Define the relevant marketplace within which to conduct the study
- 2) Calculate **custom availability** of minority and women-owned businesses that are ready, willing and able to do business with the City of San Antonio
- 3) Analyze minority and women-owned business utilization on City contracts
- 4) Determine any causation between disparities and discrimination
- 5) Determine if barriers exist through public and private practices
- 6) Analyze the effectiveness of current race- and gender-neutral remedies
- 7) Recommend the suspension, continuation, or expansion the SBEDA program


