POLICE ACCOUNTABILITY & TRANSPARENCY

HB 1087 (Gervin-Hawkins)

Authorize the Police Chief to discipline officers within 180 days of discovering misconduct

HB 1561 (Gervin-Hawkins)

Create opportunities to encourage new officers to live in the City in which they serve

HB 1563 (Gervin-Hawkins)

Allow the release of conduct violations held by a law enforcement agency

HB? (pending)

Limiting an arbitrator to reduce discipline, as determined by the Police Chief



POLICE ACCOUNTABILITY & TRANSPARENCY

Community Meeting: Collaboration with Representative Gervin-Hawkins

 GPA and City Attorney staff presented legislative priorities and briefed attendees on City's dual path to police accountability

Legislator Meeting(s): Offering language to bills that enact penalties for Reducing Police Funding

"(f) this statute does not apply to determinations by a county or municipal government to reassign services to other departments or agencies if those services do not require a public safety response from a police officer, firefighter or emergency medical service."



PUBLIC HEALTH

- DSHS proposed 5% budget cuts: City Impact
 - Reduction in staffing impacting COVID response; infectious disease control
 - Reduction in IT infrastructure critical to investigations/contact tracing
 - Reduction in testing and testing supplies related to STD/HIV/TB

MEDICAID EXPANSION

Medicaid expansion continues to be a conversation by Members of both parties.
