

CURRENT STATUS

○ BILL FILLING DEADLINE - FRIDAY, MARCH 12TH

- BILLS FILED TO DATE
 - > House 3,528
 - > Senate 1,330

 BOTH HOUSE AND SENATE COMMITTEES ARE NOW MEETING TO CONSIDER LEGISLATION

POLICE ACCOUNTABILITY & TRANSPARENCY

HB 1087 (Gervin-Hawkins)

Authorize the Police Chief to discipline officers within 180 days of discovering misconduct

HB 1561 (Gervin-Hawkins)

Create opportunities to encourage new officers to live in the City in which they serve

HB 1563 (Gervin-Hawkins)

Allow the release of conduct violations held by a law enforcement agency

HB 1940 (Gervin-Hawkins)

Limiting an arbitrator to reduce discipline, as determined by the Police Chief



PUBLIC HEALTH

- DSHS has requested restoration of its 5% cuts and testified as such to Senate Finance and House Appropriations
- Medicaid expansion continues to be a conversation by Members of both parties with numerous bills on the subject, for example:
 - HB 1730 (Larson) Directs HHSC to provide for and adopt rules implementing – Medicaid eligibility to all persons who apply for assistance and for whom federal matching money is available.
 - HJR 86 (Larson) Constitutional amendment that puts the question to the voters at an election to be held November '21



BROADBAND

HB 5 / SB 5 (Ashby/Nichols)
Relating to the expansion of broadband
services to certain areas

- Establish a Broadband Development Office that will develop the state broadband plan
- Require the existing governor's broadband council to form long-term strategies to promote access across the state
- Map the quality of internet connections in Texas annually



LOCAL DECISION MAKING

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

- HB 3 (Burrows) Texas Pandemic Response Act
- HB 1656 (Murphy) If in conflict, governor's disaster order prevails over local disaster order
- HB 2239 (Gates) Business/landlord don't have to pay any state or city taxes if disaster order limits their operation or authority
- SB 26 (Paxton) Government can't close places of worship during disaster

Community Censorship

• HB 749 (Middleton) / SB 234 (Hall) Prohibit political subdivision from hiring lobbyists

WINTER STORM ACTIVITY

- > House and Senate Committee Hearings
- Speaker Phelan announced first phase of reforms with filing of priority bills that aim to:
 - "Weatherize" the state's energy infrastructure
 - Create a statewide alert system
 - Improve communication between state agencies
 - Define authority during extreme weather events

BILLS OF INTEREST / ADVOCACY

- > HB 652 (Paul) Animal Shelters
- ➤ HB 872 (Bernal) Confidentiality of SAWS Customer Information
- ➤ HB 1869 (Burrows) Tax-supported debt (like COs) that isn't voter approved must be financed through M&O tax rate instead of debt service
- > SB 639 (Menendez) Open meetings Act/Virtual Meetings
- HB 2365 (Lopez) Reimbursement for military medical treatment facilities (BAMC)

BILLS OF INTEREST / ADVOCACY

ELECTIONS

- Limits on Debt Elections
 - HB 35 and HB 330 Turnout and vote margin thresholds
 - HB 664 Debt elections only in November
- Ballot Language Review
 - HB 782 SOS review of home rule city ballot language
- Partisan City Elections
 - HB 2092- Partisan candidacy required for city elections
