



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City of San Antonio Bond Program History



Historical Analysis of City Bond Programs

Proposition	2007 Bond \$550 M 151 Projects	2012 Bond \$596 M 140 Projects	2017 Bond \$850 M 180 Projects
Streets, Bridges & Sidewalks	55.8%	56.6%	52.4%
Drainage & Flood Control	27.6%	21.5%	16.4%
Parks, Recreation & Open Spaces	14.4%	14.6%	22.0%
Library & Cultural Facilities	2.0%	4.9%	2.8%
Public Health/Safety Facilities	0.1%	2.4%	4.0%
Neighborhood Improvements			2.4%
Total	100%	100%	100%

Guiding Principles



Align With Adopted City Plans

Projects will align with city supported plans, to include SA Tomorrow Growth, Micromobility, San Antonio Parks System, Bexar County Regional Watershed and SA Climate Ready plans.



Environmental Sustainability & Safety

Projects will promote energy and water conservation and improve storm water and air quality, as applicable. Projects will also focus on enhancing safe connectivity to community destinations such as schools, heath/wellness and community facilities, parks and public open greenspaces.



Embed Equity

Projects will support infrastructure improvements within communities of color and low income communities using equity atlas.

Strategic Partnerships & Leveraged Commitments



Projects will be coordinated with other agencies including San Antonio Water System (SAWS), San Antonio River Authority (SARA), CPS Energy, VIA Transit Authority, Bexar County and TxDOT; and leverage other governmental agency dollars, as applicable.

Implement City Campus approach:


