
What Is the Purpose of the Survey?

- This survey is designed to understand resident expectations of police encounters with the San Antonio Police Department and the appropriate role of the Police Department to keep our community safe.
- The results will be used to inform recommendations to City Council on potential calls that could be handled by a non-Police Officer or to augment Police Response with other non-law enforcement.

How Will People Be Selected for the Survey?

- Addressed-based sampling
- Sampling will be stratified to ensure the results are representative of each City Council District
 - At least 100 surveys per Council District
 - A total of 1,067 surveys citywide
- Sample size representative of City's diverse population
- Survey will be conducted in both English and Spanish

Why Are We Doing 1,067 Surveys?



How Will the Survey Be Administered?

- Mailed Survey: random sample size of at least 5,000 (500 per district)
- Residents can complete the survey:
 - On-line
 - By mail
 - By calling a toll-free number
- Ensuring participation: conduct follow-up by e-mail and phone
- Ongoing monitoring of geographic and demographics to ensure districts and demographic groups are well represented




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
