

American Rescue Plan Act Overview

- Signed into law on March 11, 2021
- Provides funding in several areas including state and local aid
 - Funding administered through US Treasury
 - Augmented form of the Coronavirus Relief Funds; however, requirements and criteria have significant differences

Highlights of the American Rescue Plan Act



State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds

- \$350 billion allocated for additional state and local aid to "to mitigate the fiscal effects stemming from the public health emergency"
 - States, Tribal and DC: \$219.8 B
 - Counties: \$65.1 B
 - Metropolitan Cities: \$45.6 B
 - Other Cities: \$19.5 B
- Projected awards
 - San Antonio: \$326 M
 - Bexar County: \$388 M
- Released in two tranches
- Funds expire December 31, 2024

State & Local Fiscal Aid Funds Broad Definition of Allowable Uses

Coronavirus Relief Fund

9 months to spend

All funds released at once

County portion net of City

Not to be used for revenue replacement

Local Fiscal Recovery Funds

3+ years to spend

Funds released in two tranches

County portion inclusive of City Population

Revenue replacement allowed

Funding Comparison

Temporary Nature of Funding

Focus	Focus on rebuilding financial flexibility/stability and restore fiscal resiliency
Avoid	Avoid new programs that require financial ongoing commitment
Enhance	Enhance budgetary and financial stability by spreading use of funds through December 2024
Partner	Partner to leverage/augment funding


