

ORDINANCE 2021-04-08-0230

AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO AN AGREEMENT WITH COMMUNITIES IN SCHOOLS OF SAN ANTONIO TO INCREASE THE COMPENSATION BY AN ADDITIONAL \$66,000.00 FOR A TOTAL AMOUNT OF \$216,000.00 DURING THE RENEWAL PERIOD FOR ADDITIONAL SERVICES RELATED TO THE PROVISION OF BEHAVIORAL MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING FOR YOUTH AND/OR THEIR FAMILIES AFFECTED BY DOMESTIC VIOLENCE FOR A TERM ENDING JUNE 30, 2021.

WHEREAS, in September 2020, City Council authorized an agreement with Communities in Schools of San Antonio (CISSA) for youth and adolescent health services to provide behavioral mental health counseling sessions that address current inadequate access to care while promoting mental health wellness through services provided by Licensed Professional Counselors; and

WHEREAS, CISSA was contracted to provide a minimum of 400 behavioral mental health counseling sessions for students and/or their families affected by domestic violence through a various types of therapy-including Dialectical Therapy, Solution Focused, Person-Centered, Cognitive Behavior Therapy, Motivational Interviewing, and Play Therapy Techniques-and provide community referrals for basic needs and psychiatric evaluation.

WHEREAS, in January 2021, City Council authorized a renewal and amendment to the agreement with CISSA to allow Metro Health to continue funding youth and adolescent mental health counseling services for youth and their families affected by domestic violence; and

WHEREAS, the first amendment to the agreement with CISSA provided for an additional 1,000 behavioral mental health counseling sessions for the term ending June 30, 2021 and a renewal amount of \$150,000.00 in compensation; and

WHEREAS, authorization of the proposed second amendment to the agreement with CISSA will allow for a Case Manager to provide wraparound and family strengthening services to students and families receiving behavioral mental health counseling sessions;

WHEREAS, the additional services will increase the compensation to a total amount up to \$216,000.00 during the renewal term; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City Manager or designee or the Director of the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District (Metro Health) or designee is authorized to execute an amendment to an agreement with Communities in Schools of San Antonio to increase the compensation by an additional

\$66,000.00 for a total amount of \$216,000.00 during the renewal period for additional services related to the provision of behavioral mental health counseling for youth and/or their families affected by domestic violence for a term ending June 30, 2021. A copy of the agreement is attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes as **Attachment I**.


SECTION 2. Funding in the amount of \$216,000.00 for this ordinance is available in Fund 2100700001, Internal Order 136000001738 and General Ledger 5201040 as part of the CARES ACT and General Fund funding.

SECTION 3. Payment is authorized to Communities in Schools of San Antonio and should be encumbered with a purchase order.


SECTION 4. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Deputy Chief Financial Officer, City of San Antonio. The Deputy Chief Financial Officer may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific SAP Fund Numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP Internal Orders, SAP Fund Centers, SAP Cost Centers, SAP Functional Areas, SAP Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and SAP GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance is effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective ten days after passage.

**AMENDMENT OF
PROFESSIONAL SERVICES
AGREEMENT FOR DOMESTIC VIOLENCE COUNSELING**

This amendment of the Professional Services Agreement for domestic violence counseling services is entered into by and between the City of San Antonio ("City"), acting by and through the City Manager or designee, and Communities in Schools of San Antonio ("Contractor"), acting by and through its Chief Executive Officer, Jessica Weaver and is as follows:

WHEREAS, through Ordinance No. 2020-09-17-0646, passed and approved on September 17, 2020, City Council authorized the execution of an Agreement ("Agreement") with Contractor for the provision of domestic violence counseling services by Contractor for students and/or their families affected by domestic violence; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement, funded by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) provided for an initial term of August 1, 2020 through December 30, 2020 with the option to renew for an additional six month term; and

WHEREAS, through Ordinance No. 2021-01-14-0012, the Agreement was renewed for six months for a term ending June 30, 2021, amended to increase the compensation during the renewal term to add General Fund funding, and amended to increase the level of counseling services in the scope of services by Contractor; and

WHEREAS, to provide wraparound and family strengthening services, the City now wishes to amend the scopes of services of the Agreement to provide for additional services by a case manager and amend the total compensation during the renewal period;**NOW THEREFORE:**

I. Amendment

A. Section 3.1.6 of the Agreement is hereby added as follows:

3.1.6 Contractor shall provide case manager services for students and/or their families receiving counseling services under this Agreement. Contractor shall provide City monthly reports detailing the number of screenings and intakes completed, number of services referred and summary of community needs identified.

B. Section 4.3 of the Agreement is hereby amended to read as follows:

4.3 If this Agreement is renewed, during the renewal term Contractor shall submit monthly invoices for services in the amount of \$25,000.00 for the first three months (January- March) and \$47,000.00 for the last three months (April- June) by the 7th of each month for a total amount not to exceed TWO HUNDRED AND SIXTEEN THOUSAND AND NO/100THS (\$216,000.00) as total compensation for the renewal term. Each monthly invoice shall include a monthly report for work completed during the previous period in accordance with the stated scope of work for the contract term described in Article III above and the amount due and owing.

II.

All other terms, conditions, covenants and provisions of the Agreement approved through Ordinance No.

2021-01-14-0012, are hereby renewed and extended, save and except those terms which the Parties have amended.
