# Transportation Investment

## SB 1 / HB 1 – Appropriations bills

- Senate's bill will advance
- Prop 1 and 7 funding maintained

## Other funding bills

- Registration fee for electric vehicles
- Gas tax increases

# VISION ZERO



HB 442 – Prima Facie speed limit

HB 433 – Stop and yield to pedestrian

HB 554 – Safe passing of pedestrian/bicyclist

SB 42 – Statewide 'hands free' while driving

SB 1055 – Criminal penalty for causing injury to pedestrian at crosswalk



## The American Jobs Plan

- Administration's \$2.25 trillion Infrastructure Plan
- Rebuild roads, bridges & airports
- Upgrade utility systems & broadband
- Build and retrofit homes
- Modernize schools, childcare facilities & veteran's hospitals





## The American Jobs Plan

# Bridges, Roads & Highways [\$621B]

- \$115B for modernization & repair
- Funding for air quality, emissions and congestion
- \$20B to improve road safety



## The American Jobs Plan

### Public Transit

- \$85B for modernization & expansion
- Estimated \$105B in repair/replacement of buses, rail cars, stations, rail track, signals & power systems





## The American Jobs Plan

### **Rail & Freight**

- \$80B for repairs, modernization, improving and expanding corridors

### **Electric Vehicles**

- \$174B for EV support, rebates, charging network



## FY21 RAISE Grant

- Competitive grant for surface transportation infrastructure projects with a significant local or regional impact, \$1 billion
- Criteria includes: safety, environmental sustainability, quality of life, economic competitiveness, innovation, and partnership
- Prioritizing projects which demonstrate improvements to racial equity, reduction of climate change impact, and creating good-paying jobs





## **FY21 RAISE Grant**

- Maximum grant award is \$25 million, and no more than \$100 million can be awarded to a single State
- Up to \$30 million will be awarded to planning grants, including at least \$10 million to areas of persistent poverty
- Deadline to apply is July 12, 2021
