Three EHS – CCP sites were noted with non-compliances during their review.		
Six out of twenty - eight classrooms did not have two teachers as required by the EHS – CCP		
Policy: Environmental Health and Safety 2 and the Service Deliverables.		



**Areas of Concern** (Individual incident(s) that fail to meet performance standard or policy): <u>Health and Safety Screening site visits</u>

Items being addressed through Corrective Action Plan responses:

- Blessed Sacrament Academy A flashlight was missing from classroom.
- Ella Austin Child Care Center Electrical outlet not covered, one exit light not working, Classroom rosters and Daily Checklist were not current in two rooms, bleach bottles not placed in locked cabinet in one classroom. Gas test expired, Head Start required forms not completed in staff files, grass needed cutting, playground fencing, and gate were noted as concerns and in need of repair.
- Healy Murphy Child Development Center Health and Safety Resource Booklet not posted in two classrooms and the water hose was not secured on the playground.
- Inman Christian Child Care Center Staff required training certificate was not available for review.
- Seton Home Child Care Center One staff file lacking training certificate and a screw protruding from one shelf needed correction.
- YWCA No finding noted during visit.

### Follow-up Activities:

All Corrective Action Plan (CAP) follow up visits will be conducted on or before September 15, 2021.
