C) Reappointing Edward A. Garza (District 3) to the Historic and Design Review Commission for the remainder of an unexpired term of office to expire May 31, 2019.

D) Appointing Daniel S. Meza (District 9) to the City County Joint Commission on Elderly Affairs for the remainder of an unexpired term of office to expire May 31, 2019.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Applications for District Boards were submitted to the Office of the City Clerk who coordinated review of the applications with the pertinent City Departments and the City Attorney's Office. Qualified applications were forwarded to the respective City Council Offices for their review.
